Starting with new venue THE SHERBORNE (venue 1), Housework is the launch exhibition presented by DORSET VISUAL ARTS. Bringing together work by artists created during the reign of Sherborne House Arts (1996 - 2008) the

exhibition showcases work that documented and responded to Sherborne House's past. Alongside this is Sculpture at The Sherborne, a new sculpture garden featuring a diverse range of media and approaches to form.

Nearby is LAURENCE BELBIN (venue 3) showing 50 Years of Light, Line and Colour, capturing the West Country in a range of paintings in his unique style. NORRIE DE MONTIGNEY (venue 7) shows ceramics, but not as you know them! His exploratory approach to colour and glaze application over his many years of practice will make you rethink this medium.

MERRILY HARPER (venue 27) demonstrates her love of West Dorset in her sublime landscape paintings.

paintings and wallpaper designs are very much worth a visit. Close by you'll find AMANDA POPHAM (venue 39) and her unique ceramics. BRIAN RICE and JACY WALL (venue 40) will show this year at Lower Hewood Farm. A stone's throw from their own home you'll still be able to visit their studios. Stop here for fabulous abstracts and adventurous ceramics and textiles, there's always new work on show from this prolific creative couple.

GRETA BERLIN (venue 47) shows work from her back catalogue, a selection of life drawings and work created from found steel, demonstrating her full range of talents. ALEX BROOKS (venue 49) combines creativity and sustainably, making beautiful furniture from locally sourced wood, capturing its natural beauty in one-off pieces.

In West Bay JOHN ADAM, KIT BENWELL and RICHARD WILSON (venue 56) all exhibit at the Old Timber Yard. This mix of painting, sculpture and ceramics sits alongside FIAMMA COLONNA MONTAGU (venue 57) and a contemporary exhibition responding to the changing environment The Ground Beneath Our Feet (venue 58). This multi disciplinary touring exhibition includes an Art and Environment discussion as one of DAW's featured events. Kit Benwell's sculpture can also be seen as part of the Arts in Hospital programme at Dorset County Hospital as an exchange piece. Next door SLADERS YARD (venue 59) hosts YO THOM's stunning ceramics as well as a selection of contemporary painting and furniture.

JONATHAN ALDEN (venue 63) showcases his unique and intriguing Art in Boxes, a selection of 3D multi media collages. DORSET PAVILION (venue 72) is a precursor to The Dorset Pavilion at the Venice Biennale. This collection of art is made locally but speaks transglobally. While the Biennale is known for National Pavilions, this is a Local Pavilion that celebrates the parish-sized thinking that is both resurgent and under threat.



JOOLS WOODHOUSE (VENUE 41)

SOPHIE SHARP (venue 79) shows her painting and printmaking from her orange house in Bridport. Depicting the Dorset landscape and its inhabitants in delightful palettes, her work also translates to hand printed furnishings. MAKING DORSET at Furleigh Estates (venue 86) and COOMBE DOWN STUDIO (venue 87) are both group shows, respectively showing some of the best of Dorset's designer makers.

HUGO GRENVILLE (venue 99) opens his studio with DAW for the very first time. Feast your eyes upon a large selection of his romantic paintings as well as a short film about his life and work. LIZ SOMERVILLE and EMILY MYERS are together again at venue 102, this superb pairing never fails to disappoint (see supplement cover). LISA LINDQVIST (venue 103) is a sculptor in any available media! Known for her ice carving, she is showing her latest creations in Powerstock, visits to her studio are always memorable.

FRANCES HATCH (venue 118) is exhibiting this year in her latest studio on Portland. Her site responsive, multi material pieces give an enticing vibrancy and depth to her work. CARO LESTER (venue 124) combines



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

Accomplished painter JULIAN BAILEY leads a group of artists, including ceramicist MARTIN DICKSON

very different approaches of beautifully



Norrie de Montigny was born in Luxembourg and growing up there in the forties, one of his earliest memories is from his kindergarten days. His teacher used to cut lines in sheets of paper and rearrange them encouraging the children to endlessly weave the strips of paper. This sense of repetition has become very important to him. He suspects there was a link to Anni Albers, the radical Bauhaus textile artist. De Montigny's conversation ranges far and wide across architecture, contemporary art and the history of ceramics

He has always been fascinated by architecture, the iconic buildings of the Herzog & de Meuron architectural practice, Tate Modern London amongst them, being particularly influential. His three dimensional reliefs with cubes and small pillars of clay rising from the surface do not intentionally reference architecture, but like so much of his work they are informed by a deeply enquiring mind and a life-time absorbing culture.

It took Norrie some years to find his mode of expression as an artist. He got a job with the ceramicist Allan Wallwork in the earliest days of his interest in clay and followed that with a six-week placement at Winchcombe Pottery, which morphed into a five-year apprenticeship.

Working under Ray Finch at Winchcombe was an excellent introduction to potting for de Montigny. He found the diversity of people - a mixture of permanent staff and students refreshing. He learned everything about how to be a domestic potter. 'There was no freedom, we had to do mugs bowls and jugs'. At the time he did not find it restricting it was only later that he moved away completely from domestic ware.

The '80s found him in France setting up his studio. Remotely situated in a hamlet of one house he was nevertheless only twenty miles or so from the Lafarge Factory. From there he bought bricks to make a kiln and they were happy to sell him small quantities of the Kaolin clay, which they sourced from Brittany to make their bricks. Norrie used this to make up his own clays making thirty or forty tests in order to find the perfect mix for his requirements. This clay was contaminated with small quantities of iron that gifted a wonderful warm reddish brown colour to the domestic ware that he was then making.

Returning to the UK he found the china clay available disappointingly pure and for a long time he continued to mix his own clay. He now buys ready-made china clay.

He moved on from tableware to making reliefs and his studio is packed with shelf after shelf piled high with samples and experimental pieces. Unusually his current kiln, sourced from Germany, is square which accommodates his rectangular bases perfectly.

He is passionate about experimenting with colour and plays with placing paperthin torn slivers of dried glaze onto biscuit fired slabs of clay. The flat tile-like slabs have become his support, his 'canvas', or



paper. The resulting reliefs are painterly. He has never lost the excitement and curiosity, which keeps him experimenting and capitalising on happy accidents. Sometimes he uses broken pieces of coloured clay to create collages of colour. These small irregularly-shaped pieces can be endlessly moved and rearranged before they are fired. The slivers of glaze that he uses are pale, pastel-coloured, before firing, and vibrant and eye-catching when they emerge from the kiln. He is searching for bright colours and fires the glazes at earthenware temperature to achieve the hues he desires. Sometimes the glaze ends up being crazed splitting as it shrinks and this too is part of his intention. He never quite knows what will happen in the kiln and this in part fuels his delight in his work keeping him endlessly on the edge of suspense.
