ARTIST'S STATEMENT: "This image sums up how I feel, as a Palestinian, when I return to my hometown Jerusalem. The act of returning feels like a journey to another planet. Each time I go back more of what is familiar to me has been lost and I am painfully aware that I am walking in a vanishing landscape. I never could have imagined that our dispossession would reach this unimaginable level. As such, my return feels as bizarre and impossible to me as blasting off into space. But returning is my right and my imperative, so each time I go back, I grasp onto the space and fuse it with my heart."

July and August 2021



Tuesday 22 December 2020. Salisbury Winter Market. Showers forecast for midday, so I set up quickly + start to draw towards the brightly coloured and spangly decorated Christmas stalls and carousel in the corner of the square. A team of workers (some of them Santa-clad) are removing the market barriers which surround this seasonal zone. Prolific music rises through Rotherford Walk behind me. A lively Irish fiddle mixes with the jingling metal clanging + clanking percussion from the carousel. To my right is the currying man's paddock + on the left Ann's Thai kitchen where brisk clattering + hissing being performed. Under which waft + mix with cigarette smoke from the 50c stall holder + a security guard who we chat to. Further west to the light-perforated plane tree. The carousel bell rings loud to announce the start of its burning ride + the little yellow horse performer its routine. Sound above to "Simply having a wonderful Christmas time" while the jaunty violin plays on and new distant strains from a trumpet (which) waives Christmas carols into the damp air + the girl from Ann's kitchen asks a customer "Ollie's want sauce on that?" and the clog dancers as the carousel plays "I wish it could be Christmas every day" before the bell dings the end of the ride and in ambulance chimes along Blue Boar Row + "Humbleberry, Blueberry, the round, a punnet, from Humpy Fowlers and the plum man made her Santa hat full bucket of flowers a finer now look! a Vindicta running "Get your face mask" are plain in colour. In the music reached a crescendo from all sides at the first drop of rain riding my paper and I "hurry to get my things" for a retreat under the Guildhall portico from where I can continue to draw about the market + stallholders heated about stalls + Umbrellas go through the market + festive colours reflect and diffuse in softer wet paving.

Nick Andrew: A Gap In The Market

Nick studied art and graphic design in Oxford, London and Cheltenham. Since graduating in 1979, he has been working as a painter and lecturer. He has exhibited his work in galleries throughout the UK, mainland Europe, and the USA.

Alongside his studio practice as a landscape painter, he also undertakes plein air drawing projects in both rural and urban environments.

As a personal celebration of 40 years since his fine art degree show, in which he exhibited large scale works inspired by the shapes, forms and colours of Salisbury market, he decided to undertake a drawing project exploring the same subject.

Nick has been visiting Salisbury Market Place and Guildhall Square regularly since September 2020 (apart from during lockdowns) to make mixed-media drawings, exploring the activity, movement and transitory nature of the market and other events in the city's bustling heart. Nick also records experiences such as conversations with stallholders and shoppers, sounds, smells and the feel of the weather, all of which are included with the drawings as written notations.





Wessex Museums

Summer 2021

Starting to research the wealth of museums in the South West made me very aware of the fantastic resources we have in Wessex. Some are small venues serving their local communities whereas others are well known and show high profile artists. A Grayson Perry exhibition opened at THE HOLBURN MUSEUM in Bath just before the country went into its first lockdown. Years in the planning it closed on 18th March 2020. It did reopen briefly and they were able to extend it but for the curators it was heartbreaking. Another casualty of the lockdown was BRISTOL MUSEUM AND ART GALLERY's *Pre-Raphaelite* exhibition. Loans planned months if not years ahead could not be honoured because of the change of date and the works had been promised to other venues. However their postponed M SHED *Street Art* exhibition opened on the 26th June.

The Holburne has now reopened with *Portraits of a Marriage*, ten sculptures by Nicholas Pope, of himself and his wife over the course of their forty-year marriage. Its poignancy, his wife died in 2020, is very much in tune with the bittersweet freedoms that are now becoming available. Sited in galleries surrounded by eighteenth and nineteenth century portraits, it is a fascinating take on the contrast between historical and contemporary representations of people. In a real coup they are also showing twenty-three of Canaletto's paintings of Venice, which are on loan from Woburn Abbey. It is the first time in over seventy years that they have left the abbey.

Many institutions have struggled financially during the last year. Without public funding they rely on entrance fees, café and shop receipts to support their activities. With no visitors there has been no income, although many of them have benefited from emergency funding provided by the Arts Council and the Government. The furlough scheme has helped but it has undoubtedly been a mixed blessing for staff. Many lost the regular contact with other members of their team and were subjected to long periods of isolation. Some staff at Bristol Museum were redeployed elsewhere by the council but many other organisations did not have that option.

Another cause for concern has been keeping the myriad of volunteers onboard. Many are in the age groups who

are most vulnerable to Covid and so could not help out at the points in the pandemic when the galleries were actually open. Now with the successful vaccination programme many are returning, which is a source of huge relief.

Some museums were in the process of undergoing refurbishment programmes. The County Museum in Dorchester, rebranded as DORSET MUSEUM, reopened at the end of May after a multimillion pound building programme which had lasted for two years. Their delayed launch inevitably had a negative financial impact, but now its spectacular new spaces are open to the public. TROWBRIDGE MUSEUM has also been undergoing refurbishment and at the

heart of their new space is a newly built Learning Hub. It will display previously unseen artifacts and there will be interactive activities aimed at all age groups. Their opening exhibition *Illuminating the Overlooked* will explore the multi-layered history of Trowbridge.

The ROYAL WEST OF ENGLAND ACADEMY in Bristol, the RWA, closed at the end of May for its *Light and Inspiration* building project, extending their period of closure by another seven months. One consequence of the lockdown was that their fundraising *Postcard* auction went online for the first time in March 2020 and raised over three times its previous total. So it will be online again in September.



RUSSELL-COTES ART GALLERY & MUSEUM, BOURNEMOUTH

A group of four institutions, POOLE MUSEUM, Dorset Museum, SALISBURY MUSEUM and DEVIZES MUSEUM, come under the umbrella of WESSEX MUSEUMS. One of the hardest hit was the Salisbury Museum. It had already suffered a huge blow following the loss of national and international tourism caused by the Novichok poisonings in March 2018. Two years on as they began to recover the pandemic caused another crisis. However, moving forward they are focusing on new and more local audiences. Poole is also about to close for refurbishment but did stay open during the lockdown as a retail outlet. Both Poole and Salisbury are intending to

develop their local history galleries. Poole hopes to redevelop the history centre at the back of the building into a gallery for maritime archaeology.

Going forward the group are planning exhibitions across all four venues looking at new angles in Thomas Hardy's work. There is plenty of scope with Hardy for exploring issues surrounding the treatment of women and the environment. The shows will target young people offering films and walks creating links to the landscape.

As part of the drive to attract new audiences the ROYAL ALBERT MEMORIAL MUSEUM & ART GALLERY,

RAMM in Exeter, is one of the venues that has hosted 'Lates' - evening events with varied programmes from fashion shows to cocktails aimed at a younger demographic. These were really successful, but were a casualty of the recurrent lockdowns. Moving forward these will start up again.

SHIRE HALL HISTORIC COURTHOUSE AND MUSEUM in Dorchester had just opened to the public in 2018 following a restoration programme, and then had to close for Lockdown. The 1797 Grade 1 listed building houses the courthouse and the original Georgian and Victorian cells. The Tolpuddle Martyrs were tried there in 1834 and the trial of Martha Brown in 1856 inspired Thomas Hardy to write *Tess of the d'Urbervilles*. There has been an ongoing programme of Zoom schools activities during the pandemic and they are just about to start again with actual meetings. In August, the artist Jason Wilsher-Mills will be installing his *Jason and the Argonauts* inflatables in Borough Gardens in Dorchester. The two-day display on 16th and 17th August is intended to draw attention to the challenges experienced by the disabled community and will be followed by an interactive game.

Many museums have found that the pandemic has accelerated changes that they were intending to make anyway. The use of digital technology has happened more quickly and will continue. Clearly there is no substitute for the physical experience of the space and seeing artifacts and artworks, but there is a growing acknowledgement that the two things do not need to be mutually exclusive. There is a good case to be made for pursuing both.

Digital technology vastly extends the reach of museums allowing them to engage with different communities. Podcasts and YouTube offerings do not need to be date or time specific, so more people can see them. Before the pandemic there had been a growing awareness of the importance of engaging with underrepresented groups. Black Asian and ethnic minority communities tend to visit museums less frequently than others and museums have been looking for different ways to engage their interest. Outreach activities in Bristol led by the RWA's Learning and Participation Manager have seen the gallery engage with refugee and Roma groups and children in some of the most deprived areas of the city.







Wessex Museums

Looking at artifacts within a space and the physical experience of artworks is a vital part of visiting a museum or gallery, and there is an increasing acknowledgement that it is essential to people's wellbeing. Health and wellbeing are now embedded in the culture of museums through the *Happy Museum* projects, which so many of these institutions have signed up to. The Holburne Museum partnered with the Bath Preservation Trust and the AMERICAN MUSEUM & GARDENS between 2016 and 2019 on a *Pathways to Wellbeing* project. This approach is very much at the heart of what museums now see as part of their cultural role in society. The RWA is including wellbeing as a vital part of their refurbishment programme and are also installing a *Changing Places* toilet facility - one of only three in the whole of Bristol city centre - which will facilitate visits by disabled and wheelchair bound visitors.

The Holburne Museum's Thomas Lawrence exhibition was their first online show, an experiment with digital technology accelerated by the pandemic. The RUSSELL-COTES ART GALLERY & MUSEUM in Poole has followed a similar route, capitalising on the interest in their digital offerings and uploading their permanent collection onto the Smartify app which allows visitors to access images and information about artworks on their smart phones.

The SOUTH WEST HERITAGE TRUST manages both the MUSEUM OF SOMERSET in Taunton and the RURAL LIFE MUSEUM in Glastonbury. The GLASTONBURY MUSEUM tends to stay local, featuring local artists and makers. The Museum of Somerset in Taunton is re-opening with the Royal Photographic Society's *International Photography* competition of contemporary photography from across the world. Set in stunningly beautiful gardens the American Museum in Bath is also featuring photography, with an exhibition of celebrity photographs of rock stars and actors from the 1970s.

LYME REGIS MUSEUM is another venue that is embedded in the local community and local artists. Like Glastonbury their most recent project *Museum at Home* has focused on the artifacts in the museum. Artist Christine Allison has been making miniature museums in matchboxes using the neglected or unseen elements of some of the museum's collection in a collaboration

with landscape poet and arts programme facilitator Sarah Acton. The project was started in December 2019 but once lockdown kicked in everything changed: "We moved into online engagement, making adjustments to the content of the weekly Zooms". They also made sure that participants received hard copy packs too so that they could work offline.

There is no doubt that the last year has been very challenging for the museum sector and they were amongst the last to re-open. There is an acute ongoing realisation that there are audiences out there that they are not attracting. One of the biggest changes has been the development of digital offerings, having

proved during the pandemic that there is an appetite for this type of provision.

Talks, virtual exhibition visits and Zoom activities have opened up the possibility of attracting audiences from wider afield. However, despite the challenges there is an optimism and a feeling of excitement as they start to welcome back visitors, who are delighted to be able to visit their favourite venues and discover new ones. Some venues are operating time slots whilst others are monitoring visitor numbers. All still specify social distancing and mask wearing. The important message is that they are open for business.





Creating Carmen

Bizet's opera *Carmen* of 1875 is probably the most well-known opera for a fiery and colourful story. The opera is based on part of a novella titled *Carmen* written thirty years earlier by the French writer, Prosper Mérimée. *Creating Carmen* is a concert-play created by award-winning writer Clare Norburn for Carmenco, a group which features Andrew Massey and Francisco Correa (guitars) with Emily Andrews (flute and mezzo-soprano). Nicholas Renton is the director of the show.

Prosper Mérimée led a colourful and rakish existence with numerous love affairs of a dubious nature. This concert-play imagines how Mérimée's wild escapades gave rise to one of the most infamous femme fatale characters of all time. The music for *Creating Carmen* draws on Bizet and Spanish-inspired music by Granados, de Falla, Albéniz and Ravel.
