

Antony Gormley: Doubt

Sculpture, 2020

ARTIST'S STATEMENT: "I am very aware of the paradox of placing an object called *Doubt* on the facade of a building devoted to belief, but it seems to me that doubting, interrogating, questioning, are all part of belief. For me doubt can be a positive force and the imaginative engine of future possibility. I have chosen this niche on the West Front of Wells Cathedral for its exposed position and visibility: the book at the end of the bookshelf. Most of the figures on the west facade stand facing the world in an open attitude of confidence, proudly displaying their attributes - regal, military, and divine. In contrast, I have used the orthogonal geometry of our modern habitat to evoke the body as a place. *Doubt* is literally on edge and teeters uneasily out of its niche, one foot perilously off the ledge and one shoulder jutting forward. In the context of an 800-year-old celebration of hierarchy, I wish to make a space for a contemporary state of mind."







Slow Time

"As part of the final chapter of the Somerset Reacquainted tour, this new exhibition of solargraphs explores the passing of time. Slow Time is the result of a project recording the passage of time initiated during the first lockdown. Led by Somerset Solargraphic Society, set up by artists Janette Kerr and John Gammans, and supported by Somerset Art Works, this extraordinary exhibition features long-exposure photographs of the Somerset landscape created using nothing more than recycled drinks cans made into pinhole cameras. Over 100 participants placed 150 pinhole cameras containing light-sensitive material in locations around Somerset and left them in situ for five or six months. The resulting images have been slowly shaped by landscape and the movement of the sun, slowly creeping higher with the passing of the seasons. The actions of the environment, like rain and other elemental detritus, have also found their way into the images, yet there is an absence of any moving objects, such as people, animals or cars. The sun's progress is recorded as an accumulation of lines arcing and streaking across the image, leaving a ghostly exposure of the landscape seen in slow time and out of phase with human inhabitants. As the pandemic unfolds our perception of time is challenged as daily routines, plans and schedules are laid to waste. Suddenly not having to be anywhere means that we have no option but to be present. Present in the eerie stillness of life we start to reflect and take stock, find new ways to spend our time, and begin to notice those elements that ordinarily pass us by unnoticed."

Wessex Museums Guide 2022



RUSSELL-COTES ART GALLERY & MUSEUM, BOURNEMOUTH

In the Summer 2021 issue of Evolver Magazine I wrote about how museums were coping with the cancellation of exhibitions and the adjustments they were making to deal with the lockdowns caused by the pandemic. As we head into 2022 many museums are coping really well and have adapted with imagination as the goalposts constantly move.

The Wessex Museums Partnership encompassing Dorset Museum in Dorchester, The Salisbury Museum, Poole Museum and Wiltshire Museum in Devizes - are staging Thomas Hardy exhibitions across all four venues from 28 May to 30 October 2022. Curated by Harriet Still they will show previously unseen artifacts that have been in store since Hardy's death in 1928. Each museum has a different display but all focus on social issues connected with Hardy's books that are still relevant today: animal welfare, women's safety and extreme poverty. It will be the largest

collection of Hardy artifacts displayed at one time. Capitalising on a move in heritage settings towards displaying more personal objects, it seeks to explore the world Hardy created in his novels. Salisbury is showing powerful letters written by women to Hardy recounting the abuse they suffered and how they identified with Tess in Tess of the D'Urbervilles. Another item in the collection is a sheep's bell. Mentioned in Far From the Madding Crowd, it allowed shepherds to find their sheep or to be alerted to any problems. The bells sounded gently when they were just grazing but rang out loudly if they were in trouble.

There is a feast of printmaking across the region throughout 2022. Wiltshire on Paper: Post-War Prints from the Bath Academy of Art will be at Chippenham Museum from 8 January to 3 April 2022. Curated by Alan Fuller, their Collections

and Exhibitions Officer, it centres on work with connections to Bath Academy of Art in Corsham. It is the first of three exhibitions running across the year celebrating the recent Golder-Thompson Gift to the museum. The first in the series will include work by Clifford and Rosemary Ellis, who founded and ran the academy, Gillian Ayres, Howard Hodgkin and Michael Finn. The summer exhibition will feature Robin Tanner and his influence on printmaking, and the final one will be of contemporary printmaking including Emma Stibbon, Sarah Gillespie, Ian Chamberlain and Ann Christopher. A publication, A Century in Print 1920 - 2020: The Golder-Thompson Gift is in progress.

Postponed from 2020, Cutting it Fine: The Art of the British Wood Engraver will run at Salisbury Museum until mid-January. The work on show, from 1920 onwards, includes over a hundred and twenty original prints and a selection of rare illustrated books, comes almost exclusively from a Dorset private collection. It includes historical work by Eric Ravilious, the Nash brothers and brings the display right up to date with work by Ann Desmet and Neil Bousfield. Alongside this they explore the work of Howard Phipps RWA ARE and Howard will be hosting a tour of both exhibitions on 15 January 2022.

Phipps is deeply inspired by trees, landscape and the Wiltshire Downs as was Eric Ravilious. Wiltshire Museum in Devizes has secured a number of important loans from national museums for its exhibition celebrating Ravillious' fascination with the chalk downlands of Wiltshire and Sussex. Curated by James Russell it explores the relationship between landscape and people in a series of watercolours and etchings on show until the end of January.

And so to snails - not an obviously segue but they do hide away and drive gardeners to despair! They are emerging in various forms across museums in 2022 and particularly notable is the focus on a little

known collector Miss Juliana Linter. She donated her extensive collection of fossilised sea and land snails to RAMM the Royal Albert Memorial Museum in Exeter and it is now seeing the light of day as part of their online series of showcases. In 1892 Miss Linter donated around 800 fossil shells to the museum. Once she was happy with the way that they were displayed she offered to donate her substantial collection of land snail shells. Many of these were exotic shells that she had bought at auction or acquired through swops with other collectors. This connects fortuitously with Trish Morrissey's Self Portrait with Two Snails. During the first Covid lockdown photographer Morrissey, suffered from crippling anxiety. She turned to growing her own food and watching snails in her garden, activities that forced her to slow down and live in the moment and helped her through this very difficult time. The film will be on show on a screen in the café at RAMM until June 2022.

There are further exhibitions in which artists respond to the RAMM collections making connections with contemporary issues. Earth Spells: Artists in the Anthorocene runs from February 2022 to May 2023 and explores how artists are engaging with the climate emergency. It features work by Kiki Smith and others who are in the RAMM collection. Equally topical is a new artwork by Joy Gregory which has been commissioned as part of their exhibition In Plain Sight: Transatlantic Slavery and Devon.

Still on the snail shell theme, those who want to search for fossils themselves can take part in one of Lyme Regis Museum's regular Fossil Walks. It is always a good idea to check their website since they can be cancelled when the weather is bad.

Old Ghosts, an exhibition of new work by Glasgow-based artist Mick Peter creates a series of interventions which are perhaps not quite what one would expect to see at the Holburne Museum in Bath! Curator of Contemporary Art Will Cooper had previously worked with Mick and managed to secure Arts Council England funding for a show which affectionately pokes fun at the museum's Heritage status. Peter has created a narrative trail through the building starting with what appears to be an archaeological dig outside with unexpected artifacts being revealed. In the ballroom there is a set for an advert for paint which looks at that moment of waiting around between takes and what happens between activities. Cooper is under no illusion that everyone will like Mick's show but artist and curator both feel it provides an opportunity for people to engage with something and work out why they don't like it.



SOMERSET RURAL LIFE MUSEUM, GLASTONBURY

Peter's work contrasts dramatically with the very different set of portraits in *The Tudors: Passion, Power and Politics* developed in partnership with the National Portrait Gallery and National Museums Liverpool. It features iconic paintings from the Tudor period including portraits of five Tudor Monarchs: Henry VII, Henry VIII, Edward VI, Mary I, and Elizabeth I. Star of the show is the meticulously painted Armada portrait of Elizabeth I with its extraordinarily detailed costume and headdress.

Changing the Shape at Blandford Fashion Museum provides a very different take on costume. It is a fascinating insight into the way fashions in underwear dictated women's silhouettes from the 18th to the late 20th century. Its display places bustles, corsets, crinolines and modern bras alongside the clothing under which they were worn.

It is clear from what is planned for the coming year that local museums, as opposed to national ones, continue to provide visitors with diverse and extraordinarily rich windows onto our past. Museums and galleries are currently some of the safest places to visit, with timed entries to control the numbers of visitors and mask-wearing as standard.



Hidden behind the scenes of all museums is a wealth of treasure. It is impossible to display all the millions of items in any museum's collection but there's often the opportunity to view them via appointment or on open days. One such venue, Dorset Museum, holds over 300 items from the Elisabeth Frink estate including 31 bronze sculptures, several plasters, studio tools, and over 100 prints and drawings.

The majority of the sculptures acquired by the Museum are displayed in the Dorset Artists gallery, and others can be seen in the library and sculpture courtyard. However, only a small number of prints and drawings are on display. Most of the items not shown are stored in the Museum's Collection Discovery Centre, a state of the art storage facility that is also visible through a glass façade when visitors enter the lower ground floor.

These prints and drawings are hung on picture racking that forms part of the new storage. They include well-known images of dogs, horses and male figures, but also a less familiar series of watercolours that Frink worked on with the actress, novelist and filmmaker Mai Zetterling for an unpublished children's book. These items are only available to view by those who book one of the Collection Discovery Centre tours or those who book to carry out research in the store. Dorset Museum hopes to offer more of these tours throughout 2022.



John Law's Renaissance

John Law's Renaissance is very much a collaborative project. Funded by Arts Council England and the National Lottery, there will be six performances in January in cathedrals from Truro to Durham. John. a classically trained concert pianist, who studied at conservatoires in London and Vienna, moved sideways into jazz in 1986 and his performances and interest have remained with jazz and creative music, much of it experimental. With Renaissance, one of the most accessible projects he has developed, he worked with long-time colleague, jazz saxophonist Jon Lloyd, Jasper Law, his son, a recently graduated computer scientist, and Patrick Dunn, an audiovisual artist.

A performance of ambient music with visuals created by Dunn inspired John to explore the potential of that genre.

Attracted to the idea of music designed to be listened to partly as background, he commissioned Patrick to create mainly abstract visuals, hinting at architecture and stained glass, which would complement the early music with its sacred undertones that he wanted to use. Importantly, in live performances, 'Patrick Dunn also has the uncanny ability to respond instantly to how jazz musicians like to change things in a split second'.

Renaissance is different to anything Law has done before. The title connects 16th century composers - French composer Josquin des Prez, Thomas Tallis and William Byrd, both English and the Italian, Palestrina - with the concept of rebirth for the 21st century. John listened to a huge amount of early music in depth in order to identify short phrases and chords to use as

samples for a background over which he and Lloyd could improvise. He selected 45 seconds from Tallis' *Spem* reflecting the vast expanse of the work, and a 6 second, two-chord sample from Victoria's *Lamentation*, which was repeated to create an hypnotic loop.

Jasper Law combined the samples and they worked together to develop a flow of sound that never became too dominant or dictatorial thus allowing the musicians to improvise over it. Although this is predominantly a series of improvisations the performances are structured with the same five pieces of music in the same order with composed melodies for two of them.

The combination of a cappella - voices singing sacred music - with minimal jazz interventions improvised accompanied by undulating abstract visuals conveys a surrounding of meditative contemplation. The architectural settings are an integral part of the equation. These very beautiful performances are immersive and also at times have a quite plaintive spiritual quality. Jazz tends to be very dense in terms of notes so one of the challenges for the two musicians was to achieve an overlaying of improvisation in which less is more. In achieving this simplicity they allow the music to float through the spaces creating an otherworldly experience.
