

ARTIST'S STATEMENT: "Ancient sites, landscape and coastlines have been the source material for much of my work. The quality of light, particularly in the chalk-laden earth of Dorset's downlands is a constant and significant inspiration. Stones, rocks and the Dorset and Devon coastlines with their sweeping switchback scale, textures and shapes have all become absorbed into my visual vocabulary. In response to these evolving environments I have developed my own techniques so as to record the myriad surfaces. I have in the distant past taught ceramics and that awareness of surfaces, coupled with the need to recreate textures, led me to explore the action of extreme heat on acrylic and oil paint. My technique of burning and stressing paint produces exceptional textures and creates a link between the understanding of the ceramic and the process of painting."

Concerts in the West

Launched in 2006, Concerts in the West are dedicated to showcasing quality musical performance in the rural communities of Somerset, Devon and Dorset. Playing in intimate venues these, largely young and emergent, musicians perform a varied repertoire of Chamber Music to an extremely high standard.

The enterprise works both ways, giving the young upcoming musicians the opportunity for performance practice on a smaller scale, whilst exposing audiences in the West County to a standard of recital often only found in big city concerts.

Director Catherine Maddocks, formerly Director of the London Handel Festival,

has nurtured the organisation from the outset. Starting with organising a small classical concert in Ilminster, the enthusiasm for such performances saw the idea spread rapidly to nearby counties.

Catherine is passionate about the thrill and unique experience of experiencing live music, and this is partly what drives her. The small venues keep the experience very personal, more like a soiree, with the audience often encircling the performing musicians, creating a wonderful rapport. Catherine is also dedicated to supporting these up and coming musicians embarking on their musical careers, she describes their work as more of a vocation than an ordinary job and how competitive,

hardworking and passionate they are, putting in many hours of practice a day.

The pandemic in 2020 was a devastating time for any musician, with entire livelihoods stopped in their tracks. The classical musicians known to Catherine feared their entire careers were in jeopardy, which made it important for a quick thinking alternative and recovery. Having been contacted by a desperate young Italian musician, Riccardo Pes, Concerts in the West went online hosting performances from August to October 2020, one of which was picked up by Classic FM. They then swiftly re-emerged in 2021 to enthusiastic audiences keen to attend, despite the masks, and rekindle their passion for live music. Riccardo Pes came to perform in 2023 when Catherine was able to thank him in person for his

Concerts in the West have a broad annual programme that consists of nine tours, with three or four performances on each, however, this is no money making exercise, aside from some PR and marketing support, everyone working on the concerts is doing so in a voluntary capacity. The musicians must be paid and venues hired, meaning the concerts themselves often don't cover costs, leaving the organisation reliant on fundraising, donors and in-kind offers, such as hosting the musicians. It is kept going "for the love of music".

Take time this year to experience one of these cosy and 'up close' performances. Many of the performers are not known names, as they are on the cusp of their careers, but you'll be astonished by the quality. Their 2024 programme is available now.

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

Sherborne House is remembered by most as a leading contemporary art space in the heart of Sherborne - a venue that brought the likes of Gavin Turk to rural Dorset and encouraged artists to respond to the space rather than just exhibit in it. After a hiatus in activity and an extraordinary amount of restoration work the venue is set to reopen in early 2024 marrying commercial activity with creative, to secure a sustainable future

Dorset Visual Arts are the chosen creative partner for the space and are now planning a full programme of exhibitions and events. DVA will re-establish the house as a venue of regional and international import in the art world, with thriving educational and community arts programmes running alongside.

A longstanding membership organisation, Dorset Visual Arts will continue its remit of supporting its artists and makers and partnering with other arts organisations across the region to showcase its members work. As it always has, DVA will focus on emergent artists to help them grow creatively and professionally. DVA will also continue to produce its flagship biennial event Dorset Art Weeks with the intention of developing a new interim year event. Having a fit for purpose venue will enable them to expand their offer further. not only to have their own visual arts programme but to host artist residencies and become a vibrant artistic hub.

Many of the spaces throughout the house will be multi functional, with exhibitions and visual installations co-existing with commercial activities, including a café and shop. There is an external building allowing for messy activities, life drawing and family events. This multi purpose venue welcomes a new age for the arts venue. Working collaboratively and creating a more secure and sustainable future allows for increased creativity and opportunity for all.





Luke Wright's Silver Jubilee

Crack out the bunting! It's Luke Wright's Silver Jubilee. Over twenty-five years, Luke Wright has built up a reputation for being one of Britain's most popular live poets. He has won an unprecedented four Saboteur Awards, a Stage Award, and a Fringe First. He's sold out shows across the world and regularly tours with John Cooper Clarke and The Libertines. This year, thwarted in his attempts to hold a street party by the philistines on the council and unable to shift the over-ordered commemorative plates, Wright does what a poet does best, and takes a deep dive into himself. What follows is his most confessional show to date.

Wright was adopted as a baby and grew up believing that his adoption "wasn't a big thing." But one night he idly stumbled across his birth mother on Facebook. This window to a world that might have been his has thrown up deep questions about privilege, familial love, and destiny. This show is an excavation of lives lived and not lived. Wright navigates his audience through a warm and honest hour of poems and stand-up with the directness and pathos that has made him one of the most popular live poets in England. With some wild experiments in form, a nervous kitten called Sir John Betjeman and a healthy smattering of drum n bass, Wright manages to navigate some heart-wrenching material and keep the laughs coming.

Brian Rice: In The Beginning

In the Beginning is a revelation, an exhibition featuring fascinating early works by Brian Rice - prints, drawings and paintings - which he made during his student days at Yeovil School of Art in the fifties and later at Goldsmiths in New Cross, London.

For Brian they were halcyon days. "My life began when I discovered Yeovil School of Art."

He could cycle from Montacute where he lived to Yeovil. There were twenty full time students and they had a lot of fun. There were sketch camps in Polruan and Porlock Weir, trips to Montacute and Stourhead, and visits to London galleries. Education was free and he was taught a range of skills that have informed his practice ever since, although he says: "It never occurred to anyone that you could become a professional artist and make a living. You were going to become a teacher."

He joined up initially intending to study architecture but soon realised that he would rather be studying painting so he swapped course. His secondary subject was textiles which has fed into his lifelong love affair with abstraction.

After Yeovil and two years of National Service he enrolled at the teacher training course at Goldsmiths College of Art.

Brian bemoans the fact that the opportunities he had no longer exist for

current generations. Small art schools close to home have all but disappeared. The building that housed the art school was razed to the ground to make way for a dual carriageway. The National Diploma in Design was replaced by the Dip AD, a diploma in Art and design which was not awarded to smaller art schools like Yeovil.

But what does remain is Brian's early work. In retrospect his gouache, Fairground at Ham Hill, which was also made into a lithograph, has echoes of German expressionist painters Franz Mark and Auguste Macke. But as Brian points out there were few opportunities to see 'real art' in Somerset, until he got to London and the visual feast of the 1960s.

Olive Haigh

Olive Haigh is an artist, musician and assistant curator. Growing up in a creative household she "always wanted to be an artist, writer and musician". She studied drawing at Falmouth University and recently spent a month in Scotland on the Royal Drawing School Dumfries House Residency Programme.

Her painting, animations and music cross-fertilise, enriching each other as the motifs move backwards and forwards in and out of the different strands of her practice. She started writing music when she was studying at Falmouth. "There was a lot of creative freedom, and when I was working on a drawing project, I sometimes needed music and words to help express myself."

Deeply embedded in Haigh's practice is the creation of characters who inhabit imaginary places which run parallel to the world in which she exists day to day. As a child she began to create secret worlds and imaginary people, writing "a series of stories about a creature who lived under the floor". Storytelling is immensely important to her and she continues to use it as a prompt to her creative practice.

During lockdown, to counter the tedium and loneliness, she revisited this practice using the social simulation video game *The Sims*. The characters and animals that she creates become very real to her and they appear in all the art forms in which she works. Her animations are quirky, moving swiftly from one thing to another, with seemingly unrelated animals, people and objects appearing in the same space. As a musician she writes her own music. Her poetic lyrics sometimes embrace her imaginary world and sometimes reference real life experiences, which are then cloaked in metaphor or allegory.

Her musical instrument of choice is the autoharp, although she also plays the piano. She fell in love with the autoharp when she heard PJ Harvey's album White Chalk and Natasha Kahn playing in the band Bat for Lashes on Jools Holland. "Both these musicians are influential to me, drawing on raw emotion and doing completely their own thing." The almost tangible senses of fragility and protectiveness as she sings, cradling her autoharp, combine to add a powerful authenticity to her plaintive voice.

Much of Haigh's work is made using watercolour, a process she originally learned from her artist father. "I find that the medium often suggests it's own path in a painting and I follow. I think it's a medium you need to work with and allow it to blossom and change, similar to a lot of printmaking." The lack of access to a press at the moment means that she has been making monotypes with watercolour and acrylic. Constantly inventive, she has also been experimenting with oils, thinning

them and using them like watercolour, and "enjoying the vibrancy and unexpected elements".

Alongside painting invented characters she often paints self-portraits, so she decided to apply to Sky Arts to take part in their *Portrait Artist Of The Year* television

series. Against huge odds, 10,000 entries of which only 60 went through, she was selected to take part in the programme and appeared in Series 10 Episode 3, getting the chance to paint a portrait of Ainsley Harriot. The self-portrait which led to her selection for the programme is currently on show in *Also Artists* at the RWA in Bristol.

Haigh's mysterious and enigmatic paintings intrigue, leaving the viewer asking for more. Their scale, mostly small, give them a jewel-like quality. They can appear whimsical and fey and frequently reference myths. However these apparently delicate paintings, like her voice and lyrics, are powerful. They stay in the mind long after the viewer has left them behind and after the music stops. Fiona Robinson
