

ARTIST STATEMENT: "As a child I slid down the precipitous slope of the Westbury White Horse into the middle of its chalk belly and froze with fear. I still experience vertigo on steep slopes, but not when I fly! I am a paraglider pilot in my spare time, free flying using thermals for lift. I often launch from Westbury. I included myself in this painting - I am under the white wing. I have a visceral relationship with the sky through flying, and it's a wonderful way to see the landscape. Many of my paintings are from a slightly aeriel perspective, real or imagined."

Od Arts Festival 2025: Thinking in Circles

OSR Projects have announced the fourth edition of OD ARTS FESTIVAL, the biennial contemporary art festival taking place in Somerset from 23rd to 25th May. The festival was launched in 2018 by artist Simon Lee Dicker and graphic designer Chantelle Henocq and has previously featured artists including Sadie Hennessy, Tania Kovats, Jakob Kudsk Steensen, Sara Trillo, Zoe Walker & Neil Bromwich, and Bedwyr Williams.

The theme for the 2025 iteration of Od Arts Festival is *Thinking in Circles*, which explores ideas of growth, production and consumption, locally in relation to the setting of East Coker and West Coker in

rural Somerset, and internationally in response to the global climate emergency. *Thinking in Circles* aims to acknowledge feelings of ecological grief and culpability in Western consumerist and colonial cultures, allowing artists, community residents and festival visitors to pause and discover alternative ways of thinking.

Both celebration and critique of the rural, the 2025 festival features 18 artists and a collective presenting new and recent works across the historic villages of East Coker, immortalised in T S Eliot's Four Quartets poems, and neighbouring West Coker.

This year's selected artists include Emii Alrai, Vicky Putler and Rachel Dobbs, Groundmouth (Harry Martin and Milly Melbourne), Geoff Diego Litherland, Adam Chodzko, Yelena Popover, Chantal Powell, Ella Yolande, Dermot Punnett, Libby Bove, Mónica Rivas Velásquez, Jennifer Taylor, and Michele Atherton.



MATT WILDING 'WINGS OF PRIDE'

Poole Pride

With its home at Lighthouse, the day-long Poole Pride free festival on Saturday 7th June plans to include cabaret, comedy and music performances as well as workshops, talks and craft.

The Coming Out Cabaret will stage performances showcasing local LGBTQ+ artists, while Dorsetborn's Writing Out Loud will provide a platform for heartfelt LGBTQ+ stories written and performed by local queer artists.

New for 2025, the 'gayleidh' is sure to be a memorable highlight, and there's no shortage of other opportunities to get into the groove with a baby rave, silent disco and even a queer lunchtime recital. Artist-sewist Matt Wilding will also be showing his installation, Wings of Pride. Quilted in two pieces and based on an eagle's wingspan, the wings are both a celebration of Pride and can also be used to protect and comfort. On the front are the colours of the progressive Pride flag while the back is all gold fabric with the thread in Pride colours.

Together for fifty six years now, Steeleye Span changed the face of folk music forever by taking it into the world of gold discs and international tours.



James Ravilious: An English Eye

"This major exhibition at Honiton's Thelma Hulbert Gallery highlights the work of photographer James Ravilious, the renowned photographer of rural life and one of Devon's best-loved artists. *An English Eye* will feature key photographic works chosen from a large retrospective show originally mounted for Ravilious by the Royal Photographic Society. Through photographing the landscapes, seasons and people of a disappearing rural England, James Ravilious, son of famous artist, Eric Ravilious, became known as an intimate and sympathetic chronicler of rural Devon from 1972 to 1999. With a painter's eye for composition, Ravilious recorded over 80,000 compelling, tender photographs of the hardships and pleasures of farming communities in rural north Devon. Ravilious was drawn to photography by the great 'decisive moment' photographer Henri Cartier-Bresson, who sought to capture the perfect moment where time, subject and action collide. Ravilious, unlike Bresson, knew his subjects; they were his friends and his community. The predominately black and white photographs reveal the inner narratives of his subjects. In the cow shed, farm kitchen, village hall, school, streets and meadows, Ravilious documented a passing age while re-evaluating pastoral myths. The rich tapestries of rural private and social life were his canvas."




Soft Power: Lives Told Through Textile Art

"Textiles have long been a medium for recording memories, aspirations, and personal histories through woven tapestries such as The Devonshire Hunting Tapestries and intimate samplers stitched by unknown women and girls. Through knitting, sewing, stitching, and embroidery, artists from across the world have transformed cloth into a means of storytelling, addressing themes of longing, loss, love, conflict, and ambition. *Soft Power* invites visitors to experience these deeply personal and socially resonant narratives told through textiles. This exhibition highlights portraiture and storytelling through textiles: themes of identity shaped by migration, the hidden lives of marginalised individuals, and transformative personal narratives are interwoven throughout the works on display. These pieces forge connections between peoples across cultures, celebrating the power of cloth to convey universal stories. Despite their postcard size David Marl's paintings are windows to much greater landscapes of imagination. Not a geography of realism, there are no landmarks that are instantly recognisable, these are places so intimate that the feeling of belonging is palpable. These are landscapes peopled with wanderers and angels, scenes where the protagonist is often looking beyond the edges of this magical place, leaning towards a greater mystery.

Exhibited alongside these works are his recent 'still life', reminiscent of the dark Spanish Baroque. David assembles a collection of familiar objects, mementoes of stories collected throughout his life. He creates scenarios that include the viewer in the universal questions of being, life and death

Exquisitely beautiful and demanding closer scrutiny, these works examine our belief in something greater than ourselves and extend an invitation to look more intently.

Ilona Skladzien

Ilona Skladzien has been making an impressive impact since she graduated from the MA programme at Arts University Bournemouth in 2018. Her background in furniture making, interior design and fashion, which she studied in her native Poland, initially impacted on her fine art practice. "It was a different way of thinking." She worked towards a freer approach, capitalising on her fascination with and understanding of materials. Her piece Nightie was shortlisted for the Trinity Buoy Wharf Drawing Prize in 2024 and in June 2025 she will be taking part in the Drawing Out Hilbre Archipelago Project, which is part of the Independent Liverpool Biennial.

There are many levels to the pieces that she makes. She constructs her hangings out of paper napkins, a material "which seduced me and provided me with endless possibilities and ideas". She tears the napkins, stitches them using her sewing machine, collects leftovers from completed works and reuses them and draws on them with a very particular marker pen which she waters down. She has been working with them for around six years and her view of them has changed. "I look at them slightly differently now I am a mum. When I started working with them I didn't have this domestic link." The hangings appear to be delicate and fragile but are actually quite robust. They combine vulnerability and resilience, which for her makes a connection with domesticity. "You need to have both qualities to survive as a parent."

Her explorations of doll heads comprising beautifully executed drawings alongside original doll heads that have been coated in white emulsion are intended as an exploration of domesticity and the female role. They are often hanging upside down or damaged and missing vital bits, and are frequently reinterpreted by viewers who attribute to them potentially darker intentions. Growing up in Poland, the cultural references that surrounded her were reminders of genocide. "Wherever you look, there are references to the Second World War and people's stories from concentration camps such as Auschwitz." She acknowledges that there is a stream within her work that digs deep into the unconscious.

In reality her use of dolls as a motif arose when she observed her daughter playing with a doll. As a child Ilona says that she was a tomboy and never played with

dolls. She was intrigued to observe how her daughter interacted with her toys, acting out scenarios that echoed what Ilona and her partner did. Her exhibition *Play Nicely*, at the The Fine Foundation Gallery at Durlston in Swanage in 2024, explored the way in which children and girls in particular have roles attributed to them because of their gender. It takes the universal call to children to behave well and to 'play nicely' in the school playground as a starting point.

Despite her wide range of materials and her youthful ambition to be a painter, she identifies herself as an artist who makes drawings. Drawing is central to her practice. She will use found photographs



for example when she is working on her paper napkins but, "when I am drawing on paper I tend to draw from life, because otherwise I would lose too much information". A core element of her practice is research. She makes written notes about her projects, spends time with things that are unrelated and investigates parallel ideas, all of which give her the opportunity to let her mind wander and allow ideas to rise to the surface.

Her influences are the sculptor Eva Hesse because of her ability to manipulate materials, Louise Bourgeois, and El Anatsui: "I still remember seeing one of his works in Tate's collection, where bottle caps were transformed into a beautiful, shimmering, soft-looking tapestry." A further influence is the Polish artist Magdalena Abakanowicz. whose artworks she identifies with because they "often speak to themes of loss of identity and the shaping of individuals through collective experience".
