This Autumn we welcome the return of the SOMERSET ART WEEKS FESTIVAL. The Festival year focuses on group exhibitions and activities, this year responding to the theme *Landscape: Flux and Flow*. Commissions and bursaries have artists focusing on place, highlighting the Somerset landscape and its rural traditions whilst working with communities, hosting workshops and providing educational resources. All set to a back drop of sustainability and improving their ecological impact, SOMERSET ART WORKS are as strong as ever in their 30th year!

Starting in the West and Exmoor you can see new works by LEO and ANDREW DAVEY (Venue 4) in Minehead. Landscapes and mixed media work made specifically for the festival. At the Minehead Enterprise Centre (venue 6), *Singer Instruments, The Lab: Bio Art Exhibition* is a SAW microcommission. Artist in residence ZOE SNAPE has been partnered with a scientist to create 'Bio Art' using their laboratory and instruments, examining her relationship with the land, sea, environment and local landscape. EAST QUAY, Watchet (venue 10), is a permanent and exciting cultural venue. They are hosts to a selection of resident artists, with their onsite studio artists - including the fabulous JENNI DUTTON and GEORGINA TOWLER - as well as exhibitions, events and much more. You can also stay in one of their beautiful bespoke pods if you're lucky enough to book in quick!

In Taunton Deane, AMANO TRACY shows Ten Years After (venue 21), a collection of photographs very specific to the county. This body of work remembers the flooding of the Somerset Levels in 2014, including before and after views. Landscape (Re)View I (venue 23) sees SAW artist members respond to the festival's theme Landscape: Flux and Flow and consider 'care & repair' for ourselves, in conjunction with the natural and man-made environment and how we live within it. This is on show at 'The Wall' in Musgrove LOTTE SCOTT (VENUE 51)

Park Hospital, an NHS Trust with a vibrant art programme. *Landscape (Re)View II* (venue 24), in conjunction with *(Re)View I,* offers glimpses into Somerset artists' working methods and processes, exhibiting a range of works in diverse media at the Taunton Brewhouse.

In Sedgemoor printmaker JACKIE CURTIS (venue 38) finds inspiration from walking field margins and tidelines, following hedgerows, waterways and flight paths and seeking found objects to create an intriguing body of work. In Mendip As Old As The Hills (venue 45) is an entire project rooted in heritage and environment and highlights issues of sustainability. It culminates in an immersive contemporary art exhibition, plus events for SAW Festival, at the historic Bauhaus building in Glastonbury. Ten artists have created siteresponsive work through residencies and working with the community, developing collaborative art. HEART OF THE TRIBE (venue 47) is another Glastonbury venue rooted in community. They invite visitors to

meet core artists who will be working in the gallery and artists who have featured in Glastonbury's famous Mural Trail, currently celebrating its 5th year.

Spinning a Yarn (venue 48) tells the story of wool in Somerset. NICOLA TURNER has created a large-scale installation out of wool for Somerset Rural Life Museum's 14th Century Abbey Barn. She explores our innate human connection to wool, the stories that are interwoven in it and the emotions it provokes. TREVOR PITT's film Somerset Yarning captures the personal stories of sheep farmers and artists who work with their fleeces. Opening at daybreak in The Mendips and closing at dusk in The Quantocks, the film weaves a poetic journey that follows how the fleeces from Fernhill Farm are carded, spun, felted and woven by artists from across the county. The film is screened on a loop in the Abbey Barn. Workshops, talks and family activities are also on offer. EDIE EVANS (venue 49) is in residence at Dove Studios. She shares recent works whilst

instinctively creating site specific responses, developing a natural dialogue with the surrounding environment, exploring found objects, gathered materials, and natural processes.

In Priddy at Deerleap, Ash Viewing (venue 51) sees LOTTE SCOTT create an extraordinary sculptural installation in a stone barn. An Ash tree infected with dieback disease, coated in limewash made from Mendip stone. LOUIS NEALE (venue 52) continues this narrative, giving a guided Ash walk and charcoal drawing workshop. Discovering the effect of Ash dieback on ecosystems and it's obscure beauty within the landscape. The Somerset Willow Farmers (venue 58) explore the day to day life within Musgrove Willows, all captured by award winning photographer JOSH LOMEN. THE OLD STORES STUDIO (venue 65) Is a non-profit community interest art studio featuring the work of EMILY KETTERINGHAM, ANNA MORRIS and NAOMI KENDALL. Abstracted concepts of landscapes seen through the

work of contemporary artists and printmakers sit alongside family friendly craft activities. Coffee bar open, with cake!

In South Somerset at 4 Market Street, Crewkerne (venue 86), you will find the brilliant EMILY QUINCE and SUE GREEN. YEOVIL ART SPACE (venue 92) hosts photographers PAULINE ROOK and KRISTEN COOKE documenting local subjects. Join them to create new public artwork for the town's regeneration project, all ages welcome. OLD TANNERY STUDIOS (venue 93) have a large and diverse exhibition of 2D and 3D work in quirky buildings in Yeovil. Last but by no means least are the established SHAVE FARM ARTISTS (venue 100). This fabulous venue never fails to disappoint, with large bodies of work by ROWENA PEARCE, LIN HAWKINS, TERRI HOGAN, KAY LEWIS-BELL and ANNIE FRY, plus sketchbooks onhand for you to explore.







Nicola Turner is passionate about the materials she uses in her sculpture. Much of what she uses is recycled: wool, horsehair and bits of wood. She extracts horsehair from old mattresses and is fascinated by the histories they reveal as she takes them apart. "You can see the imprint of the body, the shed skin" and bits of unrelated sweepings inadvertently appearing from where the hair has been picked off the floor. She uses wool extensively, collecting fleeces from a farm near her studio where they have a small flock of dark grey Hebridean sheep. She also uses wool from Black Welsh Mountain sheep from another local source.

Her most recent and spectacular installation is at the Royal Academy of Art in London as part of the RA Summer Exhibition. *The Meddling Fiend*, made from horsehair, wool, wood and brass, engages with the statue of Sir Joshua Reynolds in the courtyard of the Royal Academy. Turner was fascinated by her research into Sir Joshua Reynolds. She cites two of his paintings as influential in the making of her sculpture, *The Infant Hercules Strangling Serpents in his Cradle* and *The Death of Cardinal Beaufort*, in which the 'fiend' of her title was consistently varnished out. It took her two months working in her studio to create the 'tendrils', the component parts, of textile for the work. The original plan was to take two days to install the sculpture, but it ended up taking four days, with rigging services on site to help with the structure used to support the piece, and a conservation officer to make sure that the statue of Sir Joshua was not damaged.



Turner spends a lot of time mending and repurposing. When she de-installs a sculpture, bits of it can get damaged or torn, so she stitches them back together again. She comes from a family background of architecture, and design and stitching was very much in evidence when she was growing up. Her first degree, at Central St Martins in London, was in theatre design and she had a successful international career creating sets for opera, theatre and ballet before focusing on her real love, sculpture. This has provided her with invaluable experience in creating structures to support her sculptures and a deep understanding of scale.

At Bath Spa, where she completed her Masters in Fine Art in 2019, she experimented with all sorts of materials including cow dung and straw but it was when "I found this chair with horse hair sticking out of it, I found it very exciting".

She is often invited to make work for listed buildings, which feeds into her interest in architecture. She works intuitively with her materials, responding to the location and the ambience of a place. "I love turning up with bags of material and responding to the space."

She created an installation at Wells Cathedral that climbed up and around a pillar, and she had to work out the loadings so that the fabric of the building was protected. It was her installation in the Wells Art Contemporary that led to the commission to make an installation for Somerset Art Works in the Somerset Rural Life Museum in Glastonbury. *Spinning A Yarn* is a celebration of British wool, and Nicola will be installing work spreading up into the eight metre height of the 14th century Abbey Barn.

Her interest in narrative has always led her to respond to written stories, but she is also interested in linking the hidden stories in her materials to what she is making. As part of her Abbey Barn installation she is hoping to collect recollections and responses from visitors to the exhibition. "People coming to my work bring their own stories, they make associations based on their lived history, and it brings back memories."




